About our Keynoter

Jane Kirkpatrick is a writer, speaker, teacher and mental health professional. Her award-winning essays, articles, and humor have appeared in over fifty publications. Her novel, *A Sweetness to the Soul* was voted Outstanding Western Novel of 1995 by the Western Heritage Center.

Jane grew up near Mondovi, Wisconsin, a little town not far from the Mississippi River on the family dairy farm. Since moving to Oregon in 1974, she worked in the disabilities field, became the director of the mental health program in Deschutes County and eventually "retired" from there to homestead on the John Day River and begin a new adventure in writing, working on the Warm Springs reservation, growing watermelons, and attempting to grow grapes, alfalfa and cattle.

Jane believes that our lives are the stories that others read first and she encourages groups to discover the power of their own stories to divinely heal and transform.

Directions to Trout

Lake:

The time from Portland to Trout Lake is about 1 hour and 45 minutes.

From Portland, take I-84 east to Hood River. Take Exit 64. Go left (north) at the base of the exit. Cross over the Hood River Bridge. There is a 75 cent toll. From the Hood River Bridge, turn left and go 1.5 miles West. Take Hwy 14 (sign for Mt. Adams Recreation Area) 2.2 miles to Hwy Alt. 141. Turn left and follow 141 to Trout Lake School on the right at about milepost 23. Trout Lake Presbyterian Church is 1 mile north of the school on Highway 141.
